After the flag hoisting ceremony, our respected Director addressed everyone assembled at Golchakkar. He talked about India's struggle for freedom and how we must respect what we have, rather than complaining for what we don't have. In his speech, he also addressed the recent progress made in the college like the re-modeling of the Computer science department and the new branch sliding rule being implemented in our institute from this year onwards. It means that from now on, students of freshmen year can change their branches if they perform well in their first and second semester. Along with the positives, he also discussed what



needed to be corrected for the benefit of the institute. He encouraged the students of the institute to attend classes and do more research oriented projects. Following the Director's speech, two beautiful compositions were performed by the students of second year. The songs were "Ae Watan" from Raazi and "Sandeshe aate hain" from the movie Border. Student Council Formation

As an integral part of the efforts being put in by our Honorable Director for the continued and on-going reforms and overhaul of our Prestigious Institute, the month of August bore witness to two major alterations pertaining to the day-to-day administration of the Institute, namely, the Formation of the new Student Council and a complete reworking of the posts of the various Deans.

The gears for the formation of the new Student Council were set into motion on the 6th of August, with an official notice inviting applications from interested candidates. The Preliminary Screening and Scrutiny of the received applications were conducted by a committee comprising of all the Wardens, Associate Dean(Student Welfare) and chaired by the Chief Warden on 20th August, 2018. The scrutiny was based on the student's academic and scholastic performance, as well as his or her penchant for accepting responsibility. After rigorous screening, a total of about 100 applicants were shortlisted for the Final Interview.

The Final Interview for the posts of President, Vice President, General Secretary, Club Secretary, Cultural Secretary, Sports Secretary and Alumni Secretary was conducted on 21st August, 2018, Tuesday, by the Deans Committee, chaired by the Dean (Faculty Welfare). The Interview for the posts of Joint Secretary, Technical Secretary, Joint Cultural Secretary, Joint Sports Secretary, Joint Alumni Secretary, P.G. Representative and First Year Representative, was conducted on the 23rd of August, officiated by the same. The applicants faced rigorous and thorough evaluation, which sought to weed out the less deserving and skim the cream of the crop.

The speculations and conjectures accompanying the question of the hour - "Who's going to be the Vox Populi?" came to rest on the 28th of August, with the announcement of the new Student Council for the academic year 2018-2019. And thus, the new Voice of the Students started their daily operations, acting as the solicitors for the greater student body of our Institute.

Quoting the newly appointed Joint Cultural Secretary, Ms. Pushpa Kumari of Electrical and Electronics Engineering,

"The Student Council of NIT Jamshedpur is probably the best student body in the Institution because it isn't really micro-managed by anyone. Every single Portfolio needs a different kind of skill set and this is what makes it very unique. I've seen people transform."

While the Student Council acts as the mediator between the Students and the Administration, it is the Committee of Deans who form the administrative backbone of the Institute. And thus, in accordance to the new reforms being introduced by our Honorable Director for the overall betterment of the Institute, the Deans' Committee received a complete overhaul, with the various posts being re-



assigned and reallocated to different members of the faculty. These steps are being taken to ensure holistic development and growth of NIT Jamshedpur as a Premier Institute of National Importance. Thus, the new flag bearers of Authority are expected to guide this Institute towards a bright and glorious future
